Office Hours:

Under COVID rules you are required to wear a face mask when approaching the office window. The Meeting Secretary's Office will open during the championship from 8am to 5pm. All championship enquires are to be directed to the Meeting Secretary's Office. Ammunition payment and uplift is available during office hours.

Annual General Meeting – 2022:

The Annual General Meeting of the National Rifle Association of New Zealand (Inc.) will be held on Tuesday, 11th January 2022, commencing at 7pm. Business is as per the notices sent to all Rifle Clubs. Venue: Provincial Rifle Club.

Cards:

Score cards are to be signed by the Official Scorer, Check Scorer and the Competitor immediately following the Competitor's shoot. Alterations to the score cards are to be initialled by the Official Scorer. Each competitor is responsible for ensuring his/ her completed score card is delivered to the collection point on the range before the completion of the match. Method of recording the conversion of sighters for all classes, is to be in accordance with Rule T9 of the NRANZ Rules.

Checking of Sight Settings:

The Official Scorer is responsible for checking competitor sight settings prior to the start of each match and that each check is recorded on the official score card via the scorer's initials. This is a requirement of Seddon Range Standing Orders.

Vehicle access to the range:

Vehicles are permitted on the range during competition. Only designated parking areas are to be used. The speed limit on the range is 20 km/hour and is to be strictly observed.

Rules:

Entry is open to anyone affiliated to the NRANZ. Competitors who are New Zealand residents are required to affiliate through an NRANZ member club. Overseas competitors must affiliate to the NRANZ and are required to pay the current NRANZ affiliation fee. Visiting overseas competitors must be a current financial member of a club recognised by NRANZ and are to show proof of such membership on request. Visiting international team members enter the Target Rifle Class of competition in A grade by default. The meeting organisers retain the right to decline an entry. The current shooting rules and regulations of the NRANZ will apply during this meeting. Copies are published on the web site www.nranz.org.nz

Ballinger Belt Final, F Open and FTR Class Queen's Final Conditions:

The following conditions will apply to the Ballinger Belt Final, the F Open and FTR Class Queen's final competition should the need arise. In the event of a tie for first place, there will be a shoot-off. It will consist of one sighter and five counting shots. The count-back system will not be used to decide first place. The number of F-Class in the final has been set by Council as—up to 6 competitors, there are 2, above 6 competitors it goes to 33% of entry in that class up to a maximum of 5. The number of TR finalists has been set as 20% of TR entries to a maximum of twenty. TR place badges will be presented to 20 places. F Open and FTR badges will be presented to 3 places. In 2022 there will be no final for FTR Classic or FPR.

Wet weather conditions:

The Chief Range Officer and Match Committee will make decisions to interrupt and restart competition caused by wet weather or other circumstances.

Trophies:

The Ballinger Belt is not permitted to leave the custody of the NRANZ and is to stay at the NRANZ office. To acknowledge the winning of the Ballinger Belt, the winner will be presented with the Ballinger Belt Medal. Other trophies can be taken away on loan by the winners, at the conclusion of the prize giving, on application to the meeting secretary. Winners wishing to do so, must sign an undertaking to reimburse the NRANZ for any damage caused to or loss of any trophies in their custody and care. All trophies are to remain in New Zealand.

General Information—continued

Under 25 TR Eligibility:

To qualify for Under 25 awards, competitors must be a current affiliated member, and be under 25 years of age as at 11 January 2022.

Veterans TR Eligibility:

To qualify for NRANZ veterans awards; veteran competitors must be a current affiliated member and be sixty years of age or over on or before 11 January 2022.

Tyro TR, FTR and F Open Class Eligibility:

A competitor who has not shot in ANY rifle club before 1 July of the previous year can enter as a Tyro.

Schools and Cadets Trophies:

Schools and Cadets Trophies must be collected by a Team Representative at the Annual NRANZ Prize giving or as arranged with the appropriate NRANZ Regional Councillor.

Cancellation and Refund of Entry Fees:

Normally entry fees will only be refunded in exceptional circumstances. Refunded entries will incur a 15% booking fee. Due to the uncertain times with Covid, there will not be any booking fee charge for the 2022 National Championship.

Ammunition Testing:

There is a 4500 joules maximum muzzle energy limits and competitors may be tested with a LabRadar.

History of the Ballinger Belt



In 1907 Arthur Ballinger won outright the replacement belt with his third New Zealand Champion Title. " The replacement belt was then 34 years old and already a venerable trophy. Arthur donated this belt back to the NZ Defence Rifle Association for perpetual competition as the "Ballinger Belt" and it has been placed around the shoulders of every National Champion to this day. " The Ballinger's were keen supporters of the Volunteer Forces, whilst Arthur's wins in years 1893 and 1897 occurred during his membership of the Wellington Guards he was also, at that time, an active member of the Petone Rifle Club.

In 1910 the champion's chair was presented to the NZ Defence Rifle Association by George Hyde, New Zealand 1902 & 1908 Champion Belt winner. Traditionally the winner is 'chaired' off the firing point by fellow shooters and carried back to the prize giving area.

The title of New Zealand Champion Shot and the Rifle Champion Belt was known as the King's Prize. With the death of King George VI in February 1952 and with the accession of Queen Elizabeth II both the title and champion belt became the 'The Queen's Prize'. Often today the competition week is known and referred to as 'The Queens'.

Letter from Arthur Ballinger to Colonel Collins V.D. Chief Executive Officer NZDFRA, Wellington, dated January 16th 1908;

Sir, I have the honour to inform you that it is my intention to donate the Rifle Championship Belt won by me to the New Zealand Defence Forces Rifle Association for competition, subject to the following conditions.

1. The belt to be known as "The Ballinger New Zealand Champion Belt". 2. The Belt to be held by the winner at each Championship Meeting for one year only, and never to become the property of any winner. 3. The Belt to be competed for annually at the meetings of the Association. 4. The Belt to be shot for under conditions similar to these which now govern the Association's meetings and subject to the proviso that in case of variation of those conditions no regulations similar to those at present known as "service regulations" be included in the conditions and subject to this further proviso that the Belt shall be open to competition by members of the Permanent and Volunteer Forces and Rifle Clubs or Associations Arthur Ballinger for the improvement of shooting in New Zealand and shall not go out of the Dominion. 5. If for any reason no Championship Meeting shall be held within any period of two years under the conditions herein stated, the Belt to be returned to myself, or in case of my death to my executors or administrators.

I have to impose a further condition that the Association pass a resolution which shall be irrevocable save with the consent of myself or my executors or administrators that the Belt is accepted on the conditions stated in this letter. I suggest that in order to prevent any possibility of the terms on which the Association held the Belt being forgotten, a copy of this letter and of the resolution of the Association certified by the Chief Executive Officer be kept in the pouch of the Belt, and if necessary replaced

each year when the Belt is delivered to the winner.

NRANZ Seddon Range Etiquette

This advice is for each competitor to understand what is expected to, and from, his fellow competitors.

Know when and where you are shooting

Please make sure you are aware of your shooting squad well before shooting commences. Squads will be displayed on the Wailing Wall on the veranda of the NRANZ Hut. On your first day of shooting in your squad please make sure you arrive on the mound well before start time and introduce yourself to your squad captain who will be the highlighted person in your squad list. The squads for the WRA Championship will be different to the Masefield/ Ballinger competitions.

Expectations and responsibilities of squad members

You will be expected to score and register keep for shooters on your squad. Please be prompt at the start of the range if you are either Scorer or Register Keeper. You will of course keep an eye on your squad for when it is your turn to shoot, once you have shot, you will place your gear in a safe place and promptly get back to take over register keeping on the blackboard. You will then need to score for the next person shooting. So the deal is: You will register keep for the next shooter down on the squad list and you will score for the second person down from your name on the squad list.

After you have scored you will then take a short period of blackboard duty while the shooter you scored for drops their gear off and gets back to take over. You are required to remain on the board until relieved. The No 1 shooter of the squad is scored and RK'd by the bottom two on the squad. You will notice real quick that you will register keep and score for the same shooter while your squad is operational.

Please keep an eye out for your squad mates who fail to turn up for register keeping or scoring. This usually happens after lunch or a range break. We are all forgetful and you may be too at some stage. Help the squad out by volunteering for extra duties. It will speed things up as well.

Squad Rotation

At the first range of the WRA, Masefield, and first day of the Ballinger series, the first shooter down is number one on the squad list. For the second range the number two shooter is first on the line. This is one of the easiest things to forget about - remembering who <u>IS</u> first up! At each range change the CRO will inform you how may targets to move up.

Shooter Responsibilities

When you are first shooter down ensure you are on the mound early. Do not place your rifle on the mound until the CRO calls that it is safe to do so. (BIG Rule!). You will have 5 minutes of sighting time to arrange your gear and do whatever you want to do. In individual shooting you will begin your shooting when the 5 minutes is complete and the targets re-emerge. Listen to your scorer calling out your shot scores. Check the score to ensure you are happy. If there appears to be a mistake or error ensure the scorer has noticed. Inform the scorer clearly how many sighters you wish to convert.

At the end, clear your rifle. Take the bolt out, check the action <u>yourself</u>, get the <u>scorer</u> to visually check and insert the Empty Chamber Flag. BIG Rule!! When you come back to register keep, check your score card, sign it and deposit in in the appropriate receptacle. Pssst....feel free to thank your marker when you finish. Especially when they mark efficiently.

Responsibilities of Register Keeper (RK)

Two people are used to score and monitor the shooting of one competitor. A Scorer and a RK. The RK records the shot scores on the blackboard. Use the chalk with a little bit of pressure so that a nice clear number can be read from a distance. The RK listens carefully to the score called out by the scorer and, using a binocular or spotting scope that is capable of perceiving the scoring lines, shall confirm the shot value with the scorer. Keep an ear open to ensure there is no conflict between shooter and scorer when they are discussing the conversion of sighters. At the end of shooting add up the total score to confirm the result. Technically the scorer is "the gospel" but it is your responsibility to assist the scorer to consult on any possible errors from the shoot or addition of points.

Responsibilities of the Scorer

The scorer is "The Law" when it comes to the "official" score. You will be assisted by the Register Keeper during the shoot who will confirm - or otherwise - the shot score that you see on the target, you will need binoculars or spotting scope capable of perceiving the scoring lines and place yourself close enough to the shooter to hear their calls as to what they want to do with the convertible sighters. It is polite to ask them what they want to do with the sighters. You may ask "Keep both Target 9?" or "Keep one, Bill?" You will confirm that fact by not crossing any out if they do not want to count any sighters, or, cross out one or two sighters if they wish to keep one or two sighters. You then transfer those scores into the shot box 1, or 1 and 2 on the score sheet. When the next shot is fired it is very wise to inform the shooter - and all within earshot - that this shot is either the "First Counting Shot Target 9" if they have rejected both sighters, "Second counting shot Target 9" if they converted one sighter or "Third counting shot Tom" if they have converted both. This will ensure there are no arguments over what the shooter meant when they called their sighters choice. You will inform the shooter in a clear voice the target number or their name along with the value of the shot: "Target 9, Bull 5", "Dick, Score 4" or "Inner 4" (Why it is called inner 4 beats me). "Target 9, Magpie 3" or "Mary, Score 3".

If you think the score value displayed may not match the spotter position then you are entitled to query the shooter to see if they wish to challenge the value displayed. If they so wish you will contact the Range Office in a clear

voice and ask "Please check the value displayed on target 9", or, "Challenge the value displayed on Target 9 please".

'Please' and 'thank you' is appreciated

If you are in the group (RK, Scorer and shooter) who is the last to shoot, it is your collective responsibility to ensure the score board is carried to the next range. It is good form for one of the squad to look after the board overnight. It saves removing all your names and finding another board! Alternatively use the RO trailers to move the boards to the next range.

Rules

Please read the NRANZ Shooting Rule book along with the technical rules of ICFRA. These are available on the NRANZ website or the ICFRA website. Knowledge of the rules will save you points. You are assumed to have read the rulebook and understood it. Please ask if you do not understand any of them.

Ammunition Energy Levels

A LabRadar chronograph will be operational which the CRO, RO or assigned person will randomly use to check energy levels of ammunition.

PS: Use the bins on the trailers for your rubbish.

300, 500, 600 yds - The maximum time allowed in minutes will we equal to the number of shots to be fired (including sighters) plus 25%.

800, 900 1000 yds - As for short range but 33% added instead of 25.

Elevation Checks

Scorers must confirm elevation settings with the Competitor and check sight elevation settings on the rifle prior to the Shooter taking their place on the mound. Additionally, the Competitor and Scorer must ensure the rifle's chamber is clear and an

Empty Chamber Indicator is inserted before the Competitor leaves the mound.

Score Cards

It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure their score card is placed in the score card tin by the completion of each match.

Empty Chamber Indicators

Empty Chamber Indicators MUST be used on NRANZ ranges.

On completion of shooting the rifle is to remain pointing towards the target, the bolt is then to be removed from the rifle. The competitor is to check that the rifle is clear. The shooter and the scorer must verify and confirm that the rifle is clear by looking down the barrel from the breech end. The empty chamber indicator is then to be inserted prior to the rifle leaving the firing point. All rifles not on the firing point must have an empty chamber indicator inserted.
